What is Leap?

Leap is a national coordinator of infusion care that works with members to deliver care at home or at a local infusion clinic.

What treatments does Leap support?

Leap coordinates infusion treatments for a wide range of conditions and therapies, including (but not limited to) multiple sclerosis, lupus, chronic inflammatory disorders, Crohn's disease, chronic kidney disease, bleeding disorders, hematology, immunoglobulins, and some oncology treatments. Is home infusion safe?

Yes. Home infusion is a well-established practice supported by decades of clinical evidence. Leap only offers home infusion when it is clinically appropriate, according to evidence-based guidelines. We partner with licensed infusion nurses who are trained to give IVs, watch for reactions, and oversee the safety of your treatment, just like in a clinic.

Who can use Leap?

A Leap Care Guide can confirm whether you are eligible and whether a specific prescribed treatment is a good fit for Leap.

How much does Leap cost?

As a covered benefit, there's no additional charge for you to use Leap to coordinate your care. Leap works directly with your health plan to provide eligible members coverage and is typically the lowest-cost option for infusion treatments. For specific details about your coverage, please refer to your benefit plan.

Will I need to change my current treatment or doctor?

No, your medication and doctor can stay the same. Your Leap Care Guide will work directly with your physician, and coordinate your prescribed treatment to be administered at home or a nearby clinic. Following your treatment, your Care Guide will share visit notes with your physician to keep them informed.



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
